Dear Allan:

Enclosed is my most recent FDC for the World War II Memorial in Washington, DC. Hope you enjoy it.

While it has no Masonic markings, my late father was a member of Marshall (Texas) No. 22. One of his proudest moments was when he turned in my petition to the lodge on my 21st birthday. The picture is of him on leave during World War II following his return to the States after being seriously wounded. For the remainder of the war, he was a Drill Sergeant in Massachusetts and North Carolina. He helped reactivate the Texas National Guard (the 49th Armored Division). Following the Berlin Activation in the 1960's, he transferred to the Army Reserve and was a supply instructor until his health started to decline. He retired with a total of 43 years of service to his nation.

My son was initiated into Albert Pike Chapter, Order of DeMolay in San Antonio and is a member of Stephen F. Austin Chapter in Austin. He made up his mind after 9/11 that he was going to do something for his country. When he turned 18, he enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps. At graduation ceremonies at Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego, California in June 2003, his platoon was recognized as Honor Platoon and he received the Expert Marksman Award. In March 2004, his unit was deployed to Kuwait and then on to Iraq to participate in Operation Iraqi Freedom and where he has recently been advanced in rank to Lance Corporal. We are hoping to see him in about 2 months.

Needless to say, I am proud of my dad and my dear son. I think we can all pray that all of our young men and women in uniform will return safely and soon.
